



MISSIONARY Highlight continued Dean & Sylvia Hebron

Also, please pray that the new schedule will work out well for the students' learning. So far, we have four new students: Ariadna Hernández, Juan Carlos Hernández, Karla Fuentes, and Mayra Ramírez. In addition, we need to pray for God to provide new teachers soon, as several faculty members, Dean included, are at an age when most people are needing to retire.









Upcoming: Our graduate, Jose Maradiaga, who now serves as a missionary in Nicaragua, is planning a trip to the United States, October to December. If he can get the finances together, he would like to visit us during that time. He is a faithful servant of the Lord and works in less-populated areas teaching Pastors, holding evangelistic meetings, ministering to children, etc. We may be able to get him to White Hill for a service. Please pray for him as he and his mother with whom he lives have suffered from serious health issues.

Also, pray for our graduate, Ester, who works in translation in a hostile area and is continuing to serve while fighting cancer. We praise the Lord that she recently was granted another one-year visa.

MISSIONARY Highlight continued Dean & Sylvia Hebron

In early July, Sylvia (because of her extensive allergies to meds) had allergy testing on the steroid drops that were to be used with her cataract surgery, Dean had his cataract surgery on his left eye and Sylvia had her cataract surgery on her right eye. Sylvia has a vitreomacular traction in that eye and there was danger (because of the pressure changes) causing a retinal hole. We had asked for prayer, and PTL, that did not happen! Both of us are seeing better, even without our new glasses!

The convention for the fellowship of churches (CIEMAR) in July appointed a new seminary director, Pastor Omar Corona, who has had a very successful ministry for years at Congregation Anahuac in the Northern Mexico city of San Nicolas de los Garza. His Son, David, a seminary graduate, is co-pastor. Pastor Omar will spend part of his time at the seminary in administration and teaching and part at the church.

July 13-19 was our 'Seminarian for a Week' program at the Seminary where people who are interested in serving the Lord can come to the Seminary for a week, free of charge, to see what the Seminary experience is like. We never got a final count, but the pictures showed a good-sized group. Hopefully, that will translate in the future to more students at the seminary seeking training!

In August, our 'consuegra' (we don't have an equivalent word in English for a daughter-in-law's mother), Sandy Culbertson, had her two gall bladder surgeries and PTL is doing well. We were finally able to celebrate 2024 Christmas with Sylvia's sisters. Dean had a squamous cell carcinoma removed from the top of his head—pray there will be no more cancer—and the next day he had his 2nd cataract surgery. On 8/19, we received news that Betty Krueger, one of the office workers from EMM (the mission organization that we were originally on loan to when we went to Mexico), had passed away suddenly. She was such a hard worker for the Lord and a strong prayer warrior and leaves behind an 80-year-old husband, Dave. Please remember Dave in your prayers. The same day that we got that news, our recently painted car hood was hit by a large piece of flying debris on the Interstate and suffered quite a bit of damage. How we praise God that it did not cause us, or the other car that it hit, to have an accident and that it did not break the windshield and injure us! We have not had time to contact the insurance company yet, but we will have to have it repainted again (second time this year)! Sylvia's younger sister, Jolene, finally had her left hip replaced (we lost track, but believe it was rescheduled five times in three months) and praise God, she is doing well.

Some other new personnel have come on board at the seminary, including a new secretary for the director, Glaucia Chávez, who is now Dean's contact for connecting his Zoom classes. A new type of class schedule was initiated, involving both classes in each course (they are two-hour courses) being held back-to-back each week. This is a difficult adjustment, but seems to be working out. So far things have gone well in the new semester, which began August 18 th. Our only problem was keeping the internet connection in the first class session. Since then, the connection has been good. Please pray, as always, for good internet connections and all of the technology to function well.

Explanation of COB Withdrawal Process:

If vote today is in favor of beginning the withdrawal process, the next steps would be:

*A letter from White Hill will be sent to the District outlining the reasons for our
desire to withdraw from the Church of the Brethren. The District then responds. (Step
4 of the District guidelines)

*Another meeting with be set with the District representatives at White Hill to share thoughts. This meeting will occur sometime in September or October – Kevin Daggett, District Executive would be present at this meeting. (Step 5 of the District guidelines)

*Final vote 2-6 weeks after meeting with the District representatives, estimating sometime in October or November – 75% majority required. (Step 6 of the District guidelines)

*"Blessing Forward" service sometime after the holidays, first part of 2026

Motion made to begin the process of White Hill withdrawing from the Church of the Brethren as laid out by the Shenandoah District

Motion 2nd

Vote taken, motioned carried

Congregational vote by ballot – 2/3 majority required

Time of praise & worship during the vote count

Results: 100% in favor (81 votes cast)

Ken closed in prayer

MISSIONARY Highlight



DEAN & SYLVIA HEBRON Faith Baptist Mission

Greetings to our faithful supporters and prayer warriors at White Hill. We praise God for your love for missions and missionaries. We could not minister without you—may God bless you greatly!

We have included a lot of information regarding family events. These may not be directly connected to our ministry, but they do take our time in prayer and sometimes in ministering, and definitely is often stressful in our daily lives. We want you to understand how this all impacts our lives.

We had planned to spend most of the spring, cooler summer days and fall going through stuff we still have stored from the move. However, most of that time has been taken up with a very busy summer schedule, so that now we only have fall left to do that this year. In the little bit we have gone through, we are finding a lot of things ruined by mold, including some of Dean's theology books, most of Sylvia's health reference books which we had not yet unpacked, and some video tapes from Mexico. We had another minor flood in the basement apartment, and are finding some mold from that as well. In addition, we have discovered mold in our back bathroom, which does not have an exhaust fan. Please pray for our health as we deal with clearing all of this out.

The seminary had a successful end of semester for school year 2024-2025, graduating 3 students: Amisadai Sánchez, Josué Sánchez, Esther Noguera. We do not exactly where they will be serving for ministry yet but look forward to seeing how God will use them.

In June, Sylvia's oldest brother-in-law. Ed, had a massive heart attack but survived and a stent is working well for him—PTL! A couple of weeks later, his wife, Jeanette, (Sylvia's older

sister) ended up in the ER (with a pulse rate of 180) and then in the hospital having a pacemaker put in. During that part of the month, we had a wonderful visit and time of fellowship with two members of our prayer team who came to visit from a supporting church in Northern Virginia. Also, during this month, one of our former students, Carlos Barrón, who had served as a pastor and then as a teacher at the seminary passed away very suddenly. That was quite a shock! He leaves a wife and young children. Please pray for them. Also, in June, Dean began teaching



the Adult Sunday School class at our church for the summer, as the regular teacher was out with health issues.
