Jesus intercedes for us in heaven before God.

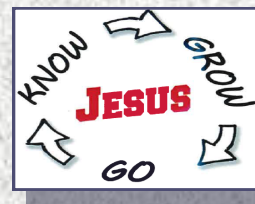

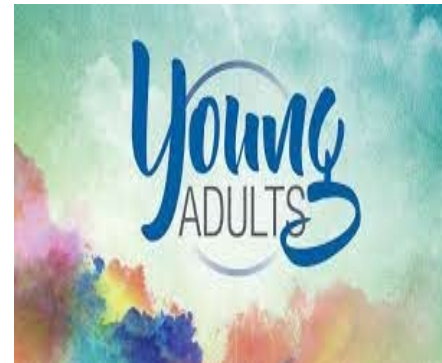

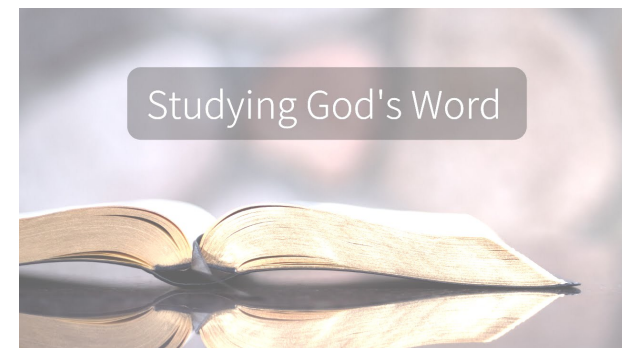

We were raised with Jesus so that our true life is hidden now in Him.

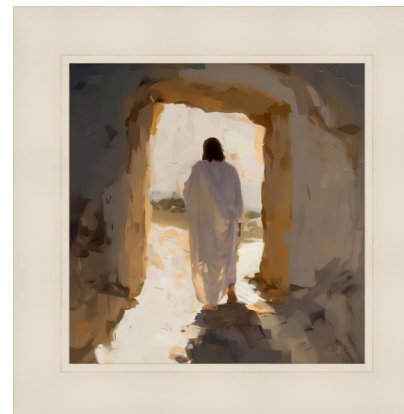

We are born again to a living hope.

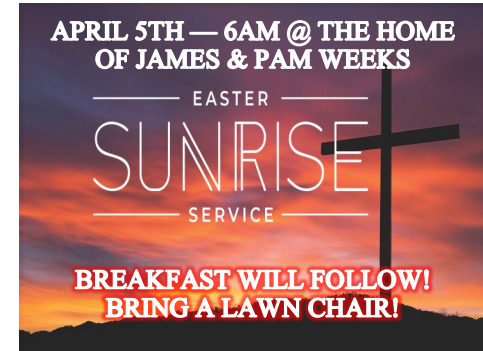

We just want to take a moment to share how incredibly GOOD God has been!

“If you are faithful in a little, He will be faithful in much.”
What started with a little green wagon has grown into a 6,000-square-foot building — only God could do that!

On March 5th, we celebrated 3 amazing years in the prayer room — 3 YEARS of showing up, praying, serving, and watching God move in powerful ways.

We have witnessed lives being changed right before our eyes. People battling addiction are finding freedom. Those facing homelessness are finding hope. Week after week, people walk through those doors because of one reason — the love of Jesus. It’s Him who draws them in, and it’s Him who keeps transforming lives.

Every Sunday, we serve meals with love — and this past Sunday, we served over 120 people. But it’s more than just food — it’s prayer, it’s community, it’s hope. We gather in a big circle, lift up needs, pray over families, and speak the name of Jesus. For some, it’s the only time they’ll hear His name all week — and we never take that lightly.

We are seeing testimonies that remind us: **GOD IS STILL WORKING!**

Recently, we heard from a young woman we walked alongside for 5 years — she is now 9 months clean and sober! That is the power of prayer. That is what happens when we never give up.

MISSIONARY Update

24.14 WORLD Leadership Seminars | Field Reports| Family News

Leadership Seminars

This year in February and March, I conducted three leadership seminars in Indonesia, Malaysia and India. The response from the young Christian leaders was very positive. The outcome resulted in rededicating their lives to serve the Lord more effectively. The feedback: First time we have learned the biblical leadership principles deeply. Thank God!

Praise God that I had the privilege to conduct three leadership seminars mainly for the young generation in Indonesia, Malaysia and India. Total five hundred leaders were trained. I also spoke in several churches on Sundays.

After the seminars, I visited the mission fields of our partners in person connecting, encouraging, praying with missionaries and their families. We also celebrated together the victories of fruitfulness and God's faithfulness in their lives. It was quite a long trip but worth doing because being with our missionaries and listening to their heartbreaking stories was more important than just distantly connecting over the phone. They were deeply thankful for my visit.

Out of many stories what one story stood out to me is the following one: This story is from Malaysia's mission field:

The mission field from Kuala Lumpur city was about 6 hours by road. The local leaders graciously drove me to Christian village. On our way I was briefly told about the persecution they face daily from another Muslim village. Both Christian village and the Muslim village are neighbors. The Muslim village dominates the Christian village and are constantly under attack because of their faith. They are stripped off all the privileges—no school for the children, no clinics, no good road and clean and drinkable water for the Christian village. On Sundays their worship services are attacked or disturbed. This is the ordeal they face constantly. It was painful to hear that. Upon arrival, I could see the reality and after hearing their ordeal from their own mouth it was truly heartbreaking.

Field Reports

Overseas visits are always a blessing—helps knowing how God's work done by the front liners and their challenges of dire situation. This helps us to deeply connect and pray more effectively and meet their immediate needs. Like I bought musical instruments, food stock for the orphanage children and school materials.

The young children seems to have no future. After knowing their situation, I asked the leader/s if I can do something which will help them to reduce their situation. Among many needs the most urgent need they shared was a need of “**clean water system.**” The challenge is that the young ladies have to climb the mountain to fetch water and carry it down to their village. At times, they are attacked by the Muslim miscreants who hide in the bushes/woods waiting to attack or snatch their water and pour it on the ground. If resisted they are either threatened, if not beaten. This is what they face daily for their faith in living God.

To reduce their constant water scarcity they needed funds to build a small dam on the mountain top near the spring fountain and stretch a underground pipeline right into their village. This was challenging, but not impossible. I was able to raise the needed amount for this important project. Today, the dam is built and the pipeline is fixed and now they have enough water for their families and for the entire village. Believe me, this project has become a living testimony even for their enemy. I was told that this water provision has become a bridge between Muslim village and them and has opened up doors for the gospel. Praise God! They are grateful for the support and love they have received as a result of my visit to them. My friends, God's people in the mission field are waiting for our visit and help. They desperately need our prayers, support and some time our presence. When we visit them and equip them with resources they do their part in reaching their own people in most effective ways.
